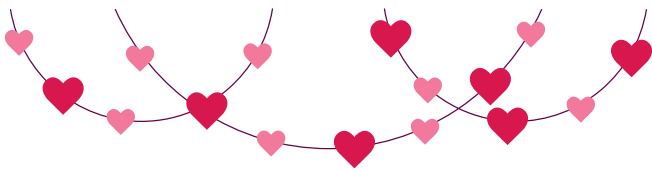

City of Menifee Update

Greetings, Sun City.

I wanted to update you on some of the upcoming improvements of Sun City roads. The west end of McCall terminates at Valley Boulevard. Currently, there is a “missing link” on Valley between McCall to the north up to Chambers. This unfinished section of road prevents traffic from using Valley as an alternate to Murrieta Road.

Pulte Homes is constructing a new residential development to the north of McCall called Cimarron Ridge. As part of their development, they have agreed to share the cost with the City to complete this missing section of Valley. We are now waiting for escrow to close on the acquisition of some property easements we needed for our construction vehicles. We expect the construction to begin on the missing link this summer.

Once the missing link is completed, we will begin the next phase, which is to widen Valley Boulevard from McCall south down to Honeyrun. This project will take several years to complete because it requires the relocation and installation of several water main lines by Eastern Municipal Water District. We expect that construction to begin in early 2027.

Ultimately, Valley Boulevard will go all the way through to Murrieta Road. This will create a full-service alternate route that should reduce traffic on Murrieta Road. We have an agreement with EMWD for the road to cut through the desalination plant property at the southern end of Valley Boulevard where it meets Murrieta Road. It is currently blocked by a gate. That gate will be removed once Valley Boulevard is ready for that traffic flow.

City Council meetings are held at City Hall the first and third Wednesdays of each month at 6:00 p.m. and are open to the public. You can also watch online on our YouTube channel. If you have questions, comments, or concerns about the City, email me at bkarwin@cityofmenifee.us.

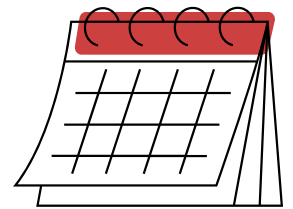
SPRING MENIFEE CITIZENS ACADEMY

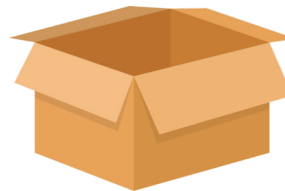

Winners received \$200 for first place; \$100 for second place; and \$75 for third place. The winning homes also received a "winner" yard sign for all to see.

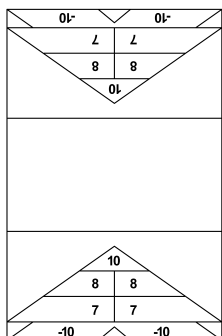

Beware of the Sweetheart Scam

Many of us look forward to finding love this Valentine's Day. Unfortunately, there are also individuals who seek to take advantage of that desire. That is why it is important to be aware of — and avoid — what is commonly known as the "Sweetheart Scam."

Sweetheart scams can occur both in person and online. In these situations, the scammer convinces the victim that they are in love and then uses emotional manipulation to obtain money. Sadly, older adults seeking companionship are often targeted and may be more vulnerable to this type of fraud.

The National Center on Elder Abuse offers the following tips to help protect yourself:

- Review the privacy policies of matchmaking or dating websites before creating a profile.
- If you use a dating site, verify the information of anyone you are matched with. A simple internet search can help confirm whether what they say is true.
- Do not share excessive personal information in your profile or with someone you have only communicated with online.
- If someone asks for money or bank information, especially if they request wire transfers or credit card payments, do not comply. Report the incident to your local police department and Adult Protective Services as a Sweetheart Scam.
- If a relationship becomes serious and you are considering living together, consult an attorney to create a written agreement outlining financial responsibilities. If the person is sincere, this should not be an issue.
- If a date or partner causes you physical, emotional, sexual, or financial harm, contact law enforcement immediately and file a report. This is domestic violence. You can also reach the National Domestic Violence Hotline at 1-800-799-7233 or visit www.thehotline.org/help.
