City of Menifee Update

Greetings, Sun City.

On February 9th, I held a public Town Hall that enabled me to answer a lot of questions that people have about our City. We held it at City Hall because we addressed concerns from across the entire City rather than just Sun City. If you are interested in watching the full one-hour discussion, it is available for free on our City YouTube channel: <https://www.youtube.com/cityofmenifeecalifornia>. Just go to the channel and search "Town Hall." You may also email me, and I can send you the direct link.

On February 4th, we received a presentation on citywide road pavement conditions. Our consultant recently completed a review of all our City roads and rated the conditions based on a set of established criteria. While all the roads in Sun City could use some freshening, the report will help us prioritize the most immediate needs. Cherry Hills Boulevard, Sun City Boulevard, and the northern section of Bradley Road between Cherry Hills and McCall all scored in the poor to very poor range. When we approve the Capital Improvement Project list in June of this year, resurfacing of those roads will be a high priority. Full resurfacing of these roadways, as opposed to simply patching or a slurry seal, will cost several million dollars.

At the same time, we are scheduling crack sealing and surface slurry sealing to extend the life of roads that are starting to reach their end of life. That will be happening through the various neighborhoods of Sun City over the next year.

City Council meetings are held at City Hall the first and third Wednesdays of each month at 6:00 p.m. and are open to the public. You can also watch online on our YouTube channel. If you have questions, comments, or concerns about the City, email me at bkarwin@cityofmenifee.us.

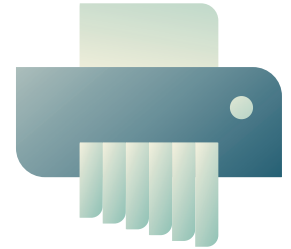

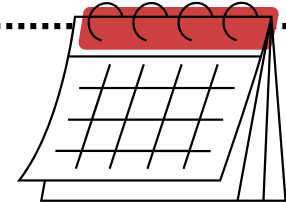
SPRING SHRED FEST

Game Day Player Requirements & Rules:

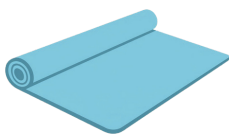
- **RSVP - BEFORE Game Day.** IF we have extra players, only those who RSVP'd will be able to play.

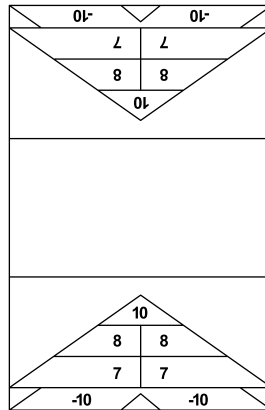
