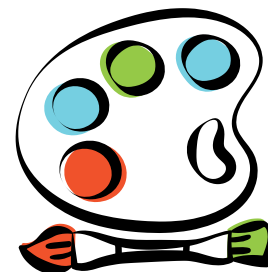


SENIOR EXPO AND WELLNESS FAIR

Rose Rhoads of the Sun City Quilting Club was recognized as Citizen of the Month at the March Menifee City Council meeting. In accepting the honor, Rose emphasized that the recognition truly belongs to the entire club whose members have dedicated countless hours to serving the community.

Over the past 20 years, the Sun City Quilting Club has donated more than 1,000 children's quilts to organizations, including the Riverside County Trauma Intervention Program, Ronald McDonald House, several foster care agencies serving Southwest Riverside and North San Diego Counties, and Cal Fire, ensuring that comforting quilts are available to children during times of crisis and disaster.

In addition, for the past 19 years, the club has participated in Quilts of Valor, a national program that provides handmade quilts to active-duty service members and veterans touched by war. Through this effort, the club has created and donated hundreds of quilts in appreciation of their service and sacrifice.

All of these projects are funded through member contributions and generous donations. The materials for each Quilts of Valor project costs approximately \$300. Sun City Slammers Chair Volleyball Club Bring Home Three Medals!

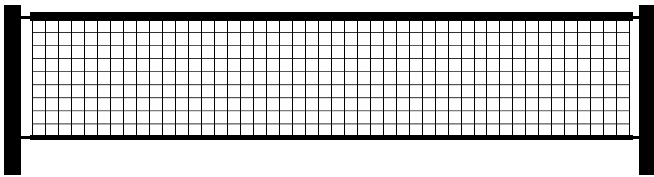
The Sun City Slammers Chair Volleyball Club had an outstanding showing at this year's annual tournament on campus, with three of the club's four teams bringing home medals.

Our Bunco Club has approximately 35-45 players every month. There are NO Club dues, and we play for \$10 Gift Cards (GCs) instead of cash. SENIOR GUYS and GALS are welcome to play!

GAME DAY: every fourth Wednesday, 1:00-4:00 p.m., in Civic Hall (26601 Cherry Hills Boulevard). May's game is on Wednesday, May 27th. Doors open at 12:30 p.m. for sign-ins, and doors close at 1:00 p.m. to start the game.

Games are played on long tables (see pic) with plenty of space for "snacks & cups" and wild dice rolls. There are lots of snacks and many winners. Bunco play is fast, but easy. If you can roll dice and move from chair to chair, then you can play! Just come, sign-in, put your \$10 GC in the Prize Pot, set-up your snack on counter, put on a name tag, and then find a seat to start the game. It's that simple!

Game Day Player Requirements & Rules:

- **RSVP:** BEFORE Game Day. IF we have extra players, only those who RSVP'd will be able to play.
- **SCCA WHITE PHOTO ID CARD:** SCCA Residents MUST show their White Photo ID card.
- **SCCA RESIDENT'S GUEST(S):** Residents may bring Guest(s), but you must sign-in together.
- **\$10 GIFT CARD:** Players bring a \$10 Gift Card (GC) for the "Prize Pot." (GCs for restaurants, grocery, retail stores, etc.) The Player's name must be printed on GC receipt and the receipt taped to the card. This information is recorded in case there is a problem when GC is redeemed.
- **DRINKS AND SNACKS:** ALL Players bring their own Drink AND a Snack to share with others (store-bought items are okay - no alcohol). Snacks are a requirement. Leftovers go home with you.

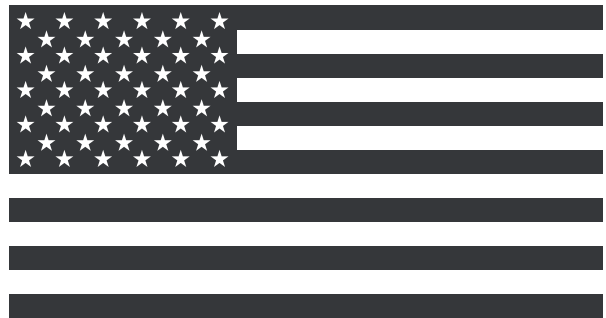
