



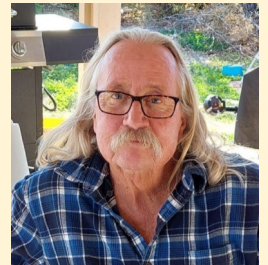

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I hope everybody is doing well.

Right out the gate, let's talk about the golf course. We have not heard anything official from the new owners as to what they want to do in taking care of, and voting on, the deed restrictions. As of today, which is June 24th, we have not heard anything from the City of Menifee that they plan to try to rezone.



In the meeting we had with the City, it is my understanding, and my understanding alone, that the first thing they must do to rezone -- let alone, the vote for deed restrictions -- is that they must have a CEQA report and environmental impact report prepared. These will be absolutely required by the City before rezoning is even considered. The golf course owners have had multiple meetings. In my understanding, some of the meetings are titled, golf course, and some titled, amenities. I did not go to any of the meetings because the Board of Directors can't go to them at this point. These meetings are strictly lawyers to lawyers now. If I were to go to one of the meetings, I would inquire when they are talking about amenities. I was approached by the golf course owner who asked what we want. I told him it is not up to me; it is up to the Association members when they vote. However, what I would ask about are the proposed amenities:

- If you are building a pool, who will watch over it?
- Who will pay for the upkeep? It costs us \$2,500 a month for our pool, which includes chemicals and the company that maintains the pool. Further, they would need to have some type of maintenance staff to brush it clean, remove dead animals, etc. so can ensure the pool is enjoyable for our residents.
- Are they going to heat the pool? Our gas bill right now is between \$3,000 and \$6,000 a month, depending on evening temperatures. Granted, they don't have to keep the pools heated.
- Are they going to have monitors there or do people just come through gate as a free for all? Clearly, they don't want just anyone coming in to use it.
- Is this pool for everybody, meaning all of Menifee, or just for seniors as part of our Association?

While I may be getting ahead of myself, what is clear is that there are many other questions to ask, not just the aforementioned. I don't know what other amenities may be offered -- maybe tennis courts, for example. However, the same questions apply: Who will pay? Us? You as residents? The questions go on and on.

I have also heard from another group that they are talking about resurrecting a 9- or 12-hole golf course. I know nothing about golf, but I am pretty sure that when we met in Menifee and here at the SCCA, he point-blank said it will not be a golf course again. I'm sorry but, everybody who knows me knows I am totally confused again.

In a nutshell, there is no word on the golf course and, if there was, I would be calling a Town Hall meeting to get everyone together to explain everything. If someone wants to ask questions, please come to the open meeting on the fourth Tuesday in July at 6:00 p.m. in Webb Hall, and I will answer questions after the business meeting is done.

Now, to a quick update on campus. We were looking forward to rebuilding the horseshoe pits. Unfortunately, we had some unforeseen expenses that came up due to things that should have been done long ago. This includes a citation to make room for SCE to access their transformer by removing the container, relocating the EPAC shed, and adding security fences around the maintenance building and wall between lapidary and woodshop. Everyone that swims knows about the hole at the Olympic pool bottom that needed to be repaired. Fixing it requires draining and refilling the pool of about 120,000 gallons of water, which costs a few thousand dollars. We also have a massive water line leak in the attic above ceramics, which requires a water line replacement from the Crystal restrooms all the way to the other buildings. There are also a few other odds and ends. We hope to get all those repaired by mid-September to October to start the horseshoe renovations.

Now, for the great news! The Board and Norma (our General Manager) have planned some nice activities this month. On Friday, July 26th at 5:00 p.m., we will have Shakespeare with food trucks. You pay for your own food and anything from the craft booths. The event is being put on by the City of Menifee. I am looking forward to the play in our amphitheater. The second event is our next concert and dinner, which will have a 1950s theme. Featured food includes a taco bar, burgers, hot dogs, and apple cobbler with ice cream. Come enjoy food and The Ray Miller Band. This will be on Saturday, July 20th at 4:00 p.m. Details are included in this newsletter.

That is all that I have for now. Please come to the open meetings. They are short as far as the agenda goes. I will stay at the end and answer questions about the golf course. Some questions I was asked from before were very intriguing and scary, but you know Sun City and the drama.

MESSAGE FROM OUR CITY COUNCIL

Will Our City Become the Safest in California?

It's a lofty goal, trying to earn the rank of "safest," but Menifee is headed in the right direction. In fact, in its 10th annual "Safest Cities" report, *Safewise* identified Menifee as one of the top 20 safest in California. The report ranked Menifee as No. 18 out of 482 cities in the state. The credit goes to our excellent law enforcement team who are dedicated to serving and protecting us all.



I remember the intensity of the discussion with my Council colleagues in 2018 as we considered the option of forming our own municipal police department. We knew it would be the most important decision ever made for Menifee. We were aware of the risks of separating from the Sheriff's Department that had served us well since 1893.

What gave the Council confidence was seeing our neighbor city's success. Murrieta's law enforcement model was working well. They were spending less than we were, had more patrol officers within their city boundaries, and provided very low response times to calls for service. The feasibility studies showed we could structure our program like theirs and achieve the same performance levels, saving our taxpayers money.

We hired our first Police Chief Pat Walsh to build the department. He did an outstanding job despite having to recruit personnel during a global pandemic and a time of national civil unrest and heated rhetoric toward law enforcement. However, that first day we went live July 2020 our residents came out to show their appreciation by holding signs that said "Welcome."

Menifee has made significant investments in both our police department and our fire services, which are provided by CalFire/Riverside County Fire Department. We recently added a new medic squad at Sun City Fire Station No. 7, one of the busiest in the County. This second medic truck is ready to respond when the first squad is committed to assisting a resident. These heroes are saving lives every day in Menifee. When you see them, it's okay to express your gratitude. I am sure that it will make their day.

One of my favorite local history stories of interest is about early pioneer Hans Christensen, a native of Denmark who arrived in America in 1877. After sailing to San Francisco,

Hans wanted to come to Southern California to find farmland, but he was out of money and couldn't afford the train fare. It is said that Hans was so determined that he chose to walk from San Francisco to Los Angeles on foot! Eventually, he found available land in Menifee and constructed his farmhouse on Antelope Road, south of Holland Road. Menifee has a middle school named in honor of this ambitious pioneer.

City Adopts 2024/2025 Budget

Greetings, Sun City!

The City's fiscal year ends in June, so each year in June, the City Council votes to adopt the budget for the upcoming fiscal year. On June 5th, the City Council adopted several resolutions to firm up the financial condition of our City. First, let me provide some background. The City of Menifee's operations budget (the cost to run the City) for 2024/2025 is estimated to be \$94,801,925. The City's anticipated revenue for 2024/25 is \$95,134,091. This means that, not only does Menifee have a balanced budget, but we also have a slight surplus. We currently have 332.5 full-time employees, including our 74 sworn police officers.

Our current fiscal policy is to set aside 35% of our operations budget in a "reserve fund," so we can continue operations without interruption in the case of a severe economic downturn. At our most recent meeting, the City Council voted 3-1 to increase our reserve fund to 40%. Councilman Ricky Estrada voted "no," and Councilman Dean Deines was absent due to illness. The money to cover that additional 5% increase is already in our account. We will just be designating it to the "reserve fund" to ensure that it is protected for the future.

In addition, the City has budgeted \$15,577,212 for 2024/2025 capital improvements around the City, including adding a police substation in Sun City, resurfacing roads in several Sun City neighborhoods, altering the median on McCall in front of Chase Bank to create a longer left turn pocket, and adding a new median on Sun City Boulevard to slow traffic.

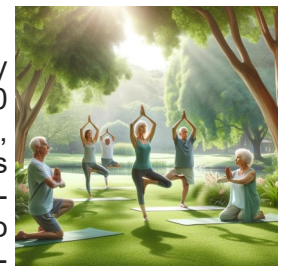

Message From the General Manager

I hope everyone is staying cool and hydrated through these heat waves.

Brian touched on several of the unexpected repairs that we were hit with recently. Unfortunately, there is not much we can do to prevent them, and we will address them as they come up.

One example of the unexpected was that we were cited by the Fire Department earlier this year due to an inspection that is now required by the City of Menifee. This required that all exit lights on campus be tested to ensure they work in case of a power outage. Unfortunately, when the electrician conducted the test, it was found that none of the exit lights were connected to power, meaning they would not work if the power went out. These have all been wired and tested, so they now work. However, the cost of this as well as all the other things cited have cost approximately \$25,000. These were things done incorrectly many years ago, so we were not aware until now.

Another unexpected project is the replacement of the admin building roof. We were told that the roof had been replaced in the last 10 years or so, but unfortunately that was not the case. It had not been replaced in at least 20+ years. The roof leaked extensively during the last rainstorms, which caused interior damage. The point is there many unknowns that we cannot prepare for and will need to address as they come along.

On another note, how many of you attended the dueling pianos event? It was such a GREAT event that we will be adding a second concert sometime in September. I've not seen so many residents dancing throughout an entire event!
