A big reminder about HOA assessments: they are due every year by February 15th, including 2026. Bills will be mailed out by late December 2025.

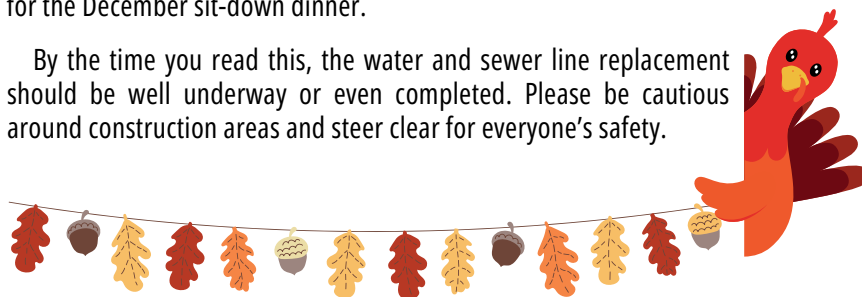

City of Menifee Update

Greetings, Sun City.

I wanted to tell you about two new restaurants that will be coming to Menifee: Denny's and Richie's Diner.

Denny's will be constructed in the lot at the corner of Bradley and Newport Road. Richie's Diner will be constructed in the LA Fitness plaza on the east side of I-215, at the corner of Antelope and Newport Road. Both are being built from the ground up, so it will be about a year before they are open. This is great news for our city.

In other news, due to the Mayor's military deployment, I will be presenting Menifee's State of the City address. The presentation will be on November 7th, starting at 6:00 p.m. at the Mt. San Jacinto College campus. The event is open to the public and free to attend.

I will be providing a full overview of the City's projects, financial condition, and future plans. If you are able to attend, please come up and say "hello." We will also be broadcasting it live on our YouTube channel, which you can see at www.youtube.com/cityofmenifeecalifornia. This is the same channel that broadcasts our City Council meetings.

The presentation will be rebroadcast later on our Menifee TV channel. You can find that through the following cable providers:

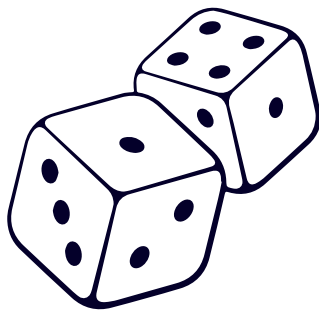
The Bunco Fun Bunch Will Return in January 2026
