



## Message from the President

### Merry Christmas, everyone!

I hope you are all looking forward to the holiday season as much as I am. Christmas is always a joyful and meaningful time for me and my family, and I wish the same for each of you.

I want to take a moment to reflect on the tremendous progress we have made this year as an Association. From budgeting to project completion, this has been a very successful year—something every resident should be proud of. I would also like to commend our management team, led by Norma Zermeno, for their outstanding work. Their dedication to keeping us informed and navigating the challenges that come from working with city, county, state, and federal agencies is invaluable.

One of our major accomplishments this year was the sewer system and water line replacement project. The work turned out excellent. We stayed on budget at \$179,000, and the improvements should serve us well for the next 40 years. Everything is now open, with the exception of the Olympic pool, which will remain closed for the season until May. All bathrooms and showers are open, and the spa is fully operational with a new heater. I have personally started using it again for the first time in years. It is clean, comfortable, and a great amenity. If you ever have concerns, please notify the office.

Campus activities are in full swing, and many clubs are enjoying their holiday celebrations. The November Town Hall also went well with plenty of questions answered. If you still have questions or concerns, I encourage you to attend our next Open Board Meeting on the fourth Tuesday of January. The Board will be taking a short break in December to spend time with our families.

If you have not heard, we are hosting a Christmas Party on December 6th. We have space for 150 attendees. You can sign up at the office. Tickets are \$10 per person, and each attendee may bring one guest.

We will also be giving out 250 Christmas dinners, and we need volunteers to help with deliveries. While we hope many of our Thanksgiving volunteers return, we always welcome new helping hands. The more volunteers we have, the lighter the load for everyone, so please consider joining us.

Before I close, I need to address an important matter about late HOA assessments. Under our governing documents and state laws, we are required to send late notices on February 15th each year to any homeowner who has not paid their assessment. The Association must pay the cost of these notices upfront, and then those costs are billed back to the homeowners. Since 2020, the cost per notice has been \$15, but beginning January 2026, the fee will increase to \$25.

To give perspective, our first round of late notices in 2025 totaled 800 homes. That is a significant expense for the Association. Late notices go out four times per year, and while we recoup most of the costs, not all are recovered.

**If you are unable to pay your assessment in full, please contact Avalon Management at 951-746-5410 or email [suncity@avalonweb.com](mailto:suncity@avalonweb.com) to set up a payment plan.** Starting a plan early—ideally in January—reduces monthly payments and helps avoid late fees altogether. When you see the upcoming budget, you will notice that we were fortunate to keep the fee increase to just \$15, bringing the annual total to \$450—only slightly more than a dollar a month.

With that, I wish all of you a very Merry Christmas, and I look forward to a wonderful new year ahead.

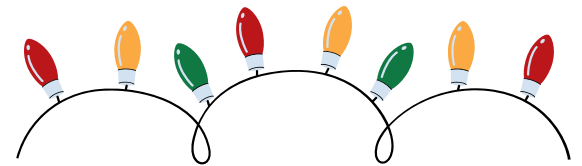

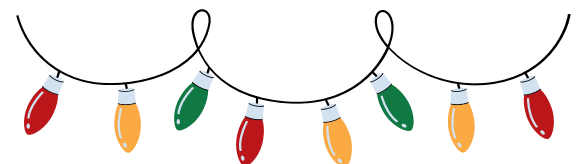

# City of Menifee Update

Greetings, Sun City.

Recently, many of you received a flyer about condition issues on the former golf course properties. This flyer was not created, authorized, distributed, or endorsed by me. It was created and distributed by an anonymous person or organization who chose not to identify themselves on the flyer.

I would like to update on what I know about the properties. One consistent concern is the rodents (ground squirrels, rats, gophers, etc.) coming from the golf course property and into adjacent yards. In January, the state of California banned the chemicals that are traditionally used for rodent management. As an alternative, Ambient Communities is preparing to install owl boxes. Owls prey on rodents and have proven successful in wine country. Unfortunately, they also prey on small dogs and cats, which are common pets for our seniors. Notifications will be going out to residents when the boxes are installed so you can keep a watchful eye on your small pets.

The City has ramped up code enforcement on the property. In response, Ambient has published a maintenance schedule for mowing and watering. It is available to you at the following link: <https://thecherryhillproject.com/maintenance/>. That page also contains a form for you to submit specific maintenance requests directly to Ambient. You are welcome to continue to send our reports and comments directly to me, but please also submit them directly to Ambient, as the corrections are their direct responsibility.

The Bradley Bridge is proceeding on schedule. If weather cooperates, there is a possibility that they could finish early. We will monitor the progress to make sure they do not fall behind.

City Council meetings are held at City Hall the first and third Wednesdays of each month at 6:00 p.m. and are open to the public. You can also watch online on our YouTube channel. 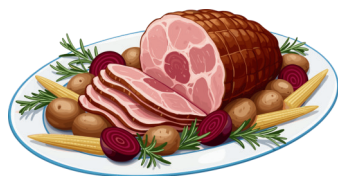

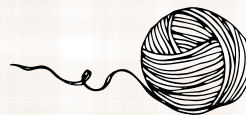
