Within the next few weeks, the water and sewer pipes in the west parking lot will be replaced. Once the work begins, the main gates to Olympic pool will be closed along with parking lot -- just like when SCE replaced the vault. This project was moved up due to the leak in the parking lot. Be careful with that, please.

Regarding the golf course, Norma and I have spoken at length with Councilman Karwin and Terrence of Code Enforcement. It is a violation to not water the trees, cut down trees and not replace them, and not deal with the rodents (squirrels and gophers), which are out of control. I do not live on the golf course. Yet, the rodents are getting into my yard with a brick wall. In speaking with Terrence and Karwin, Karwin has said that, if you email him about these violations, he will turn it over to Code Enforcement.

Karwin's email is bkarwin@cityofmenifee.us. In the email, include your address, name, and phone number as well as explain what is wrong. The issues will then be addressed by the City.

Hopefully, we can get the owners of the golf course to correct these. Ambient is the company, but the deed says Oceana. I will share a couple of things I have received. A lot of people say Ambient did not do their due diligence when buying this property, and I beg to differ. The owner, Wade Hall, said he worked for the prior owners in South Korea for 10 years. I am sure it got around what happened here, so he knew so I do not feel sorry for him with what he got himself into. I received a copy of the deed, and they combined the North Course and South Course with all tracts, lots, and APN numbers together with the deed signed and the check turned over at the U.S. Embassy in South Korea. We fought



the old owners for 16 years against building on the golf course and now this happens.

The second thing I found out is The Colony in Murrieta has gone through the same type of thing. They won as their CC&Rs say they must maintain the golf course -- not like ours, which says it must remain a golf course. The Colony won in court, but there is an appeal in process. There is a court ruling in place to help us. For this reason, we believe this is why we have not heard from Ambient/Oceana. One thing I will say is that some people noted, even when the golf course was green, coyotes use the fairways as smorgasbord. They run along the fence and jump over to get the pets. When you have your animals out back, please be very wary. Coyotes can jump six feet. My neighbor has witnessed this firsthand. Be very careful as lots of people have lost their pets.

City of Menifee Update

Greetings, Sun City.

On August 6th, the City Council approved a purchase agreement for the property we will use to build a new park in Sun City. The property is a vacant lot at the northwest corner of Roanoke Road and Portsmouth Drive from the Faith Lutheran Church for which we paid \$450,741.15. The plan is to construct a passive park/green space for public use.

Based on the input we received from the large number of residents who attended community forums over the past year, the new park will have a quarter-mile walking path with solar lighting, shaded benches, and a rose garden. This park is intended for use by seniors, rather than families, so it will not have play structures.

The next step will be to send a request for bids from construction contractors. We do not yet have a date for the start of construction. I will update you further once we have that schedule.

In other news, our Mayor, Ricky Estrada, serves in the U.S. Air Force Reserves. He was notified that his unit is being deployed to active duty overseas in October. Since I am the current Mayor Pro Tem, I will be taking over mayoral duties during his absence. This is a temporary departure, so Mayor Estrada will retain his title as Mayor during his absence, and I will remain Mayor Pro Tem. During that time, I will continue to serve District 1, including Sun City, along with these additional responsibilities

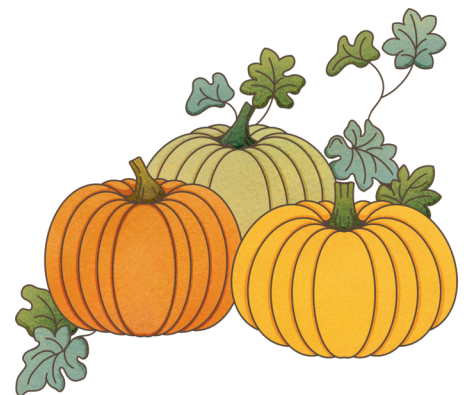

The winning raffle ticket for this shelf will be drawn on Friday, October 31st at 12:00 p.m.



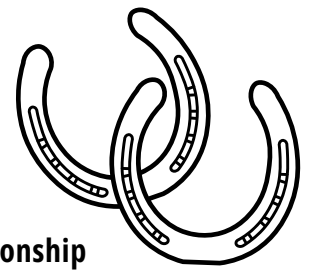

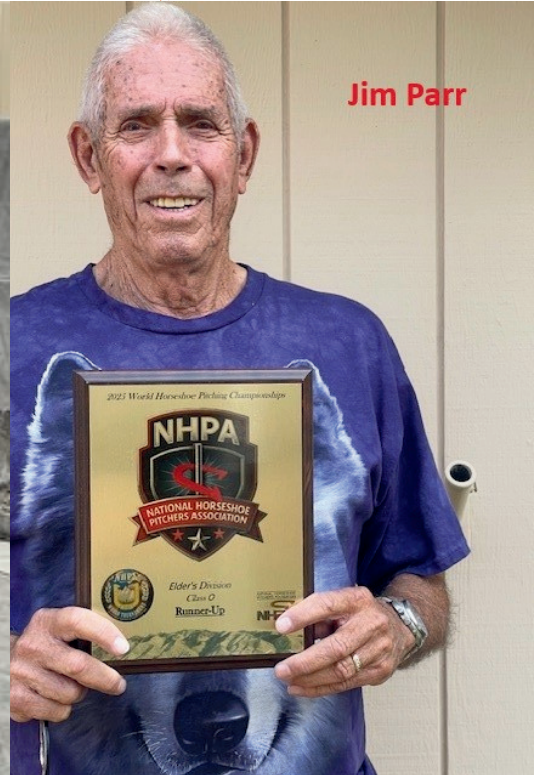

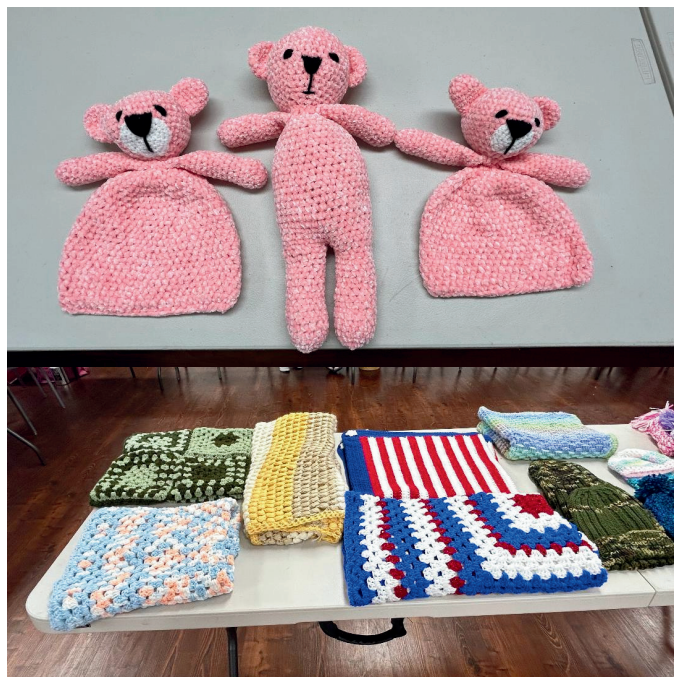
